Sermon Notes:

INTRODUCTION

- Generosity vs. greed
- Fruit of the Spirit sometimes reads – love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness...and sometimes generosity

GENEROSITY

- How do we use our time, talent, and treasure to honor God and further the Kingdom of God?
- All given gifts by God – and sometimes in different amounts

BACKGROUND OF PASSAGE

- This passage explains Jesus' teaching to guard against all kinds of greed
- Rich man's attitude was that he would have an easy life because he had everything he could want
- He was not rich toward God – didn't enhance kingdom, didn't help people who needed food, but stored up more than he could possibly use
- Can we resist those temptations? Doesn't mean we can't ever look nice or buy things, but is our focus to be rich toward self or rich toward God?

- What is our attitude toward our wealth?
- How do we use what God has given us? – time, talent, treasure
- Generosity is a way we live – we live with our eyes open toward the needs of others and ways to further God's Kingdom
