Sermon Notes:

Background of Text

- Part 1: Jesus comes to the temple to teach
- Part 2: the leaders bring the woman to Jesus, mostly to test him
- Part 3: Jesus writes in the dirt
- Part 4: Jesus tells the woman “go and leave your life of sin.”

Misuse of the Text

- This text is not saying that Jesus approved of what this woman was doing or approves of sin in general.
- We tend to quote this when people are trying to mention a sin in our own lives: “You’re a sinner, too. You can’t throw stones at me.”

The Kindness of Christ

- He treats this woman with tremendous respect and love
- Because Christ died for us, we are pardoned. But we’re not acquitted. We do sin, and we deserve to die for it. Jesus did not acquit the woman in adultery and say, “You didn’t do this.” He pardoned her from having to die, and said, “Leave your life of sin.”
- What sin or sins do you find yourself falling into over and over again?
- Can you hear him saying that he loves you so much that he doesn’t want to leave you in the muck and mire?
