Sermon Notes:

INTRODUCTION

- Responsibility to other believers
- Different from responsibility for
- Burden is like a boulder, own load is like a backpack – certain things are only ours. But boulders...we carry together.
- Jonathan strengthened David's hand in the Lord. Other versions: "Jonathan helped David find strength in the Lord his God."

BACKGROUND OF PASSAGE

- Saul first king of Israel
- King Saul strayed from God, very jealous of David.
- Jonathan hears that David is in the Wilderness of Ziph, and goes down to strengthen his hand in God.

FOR US TODAY

- Jonathan came to David. Are we involved enough in each other's lives to know if someone is struggling?
- Jonathan encouraged David. When we interact with each other understanding that we all sin and fall short of the glory of God, we come with humility and stand next to them as a fellow sinner who has been saved by grace.
- Jonathan pointed David to God. He wisely and confidently pointed him right to God. When we walk together as Christians, we are walking the same path and pointing in the same direction...toward Christ.
- Are you able to be a Jonathan right now? Jonathan was able to step back, assess the entire situation, and then step into it with compassion, confidence, wisdom, and encouragement.
- Can we be compassionate, wise, encouraging, and confident—and step into people's lives?
