Sermon Notes:

Introduction:

- Sermons often extol Mary as being the ultimate disciple. Martha is condemned, mocked, laughed at.
- We have more in common with Martha than we do Mary – today we are going to talk about fear.

Background of Passage:

- The focus is not that people should be unconcerned with household chores, but that the proper attitude toward Jesus is to listen to Him and obey His words
- Verse 40 – distracted / Verse 41 – worried and upset
 - Distracted – drawn with anxiety, chronic
 - Worried – in an uproar
 - Upset – tumult; inward anxiety and outward agitation

Fear:

- How do you respond to fear?
- Pandemic has brought about a lot of fear...
 - Fear of the virus or catching the virus or giving it to someone else
 - Fear of liberty being taken away
 - Fear propagated by the media
 - Fear of never getting back to normal
 - Fear of whether or not the economy will fully recover
- Other fears...
 - Election – lot at stake for presidential and senate seats
 - Things in our own lives – health issues, family issues
- 2 Timothy 1:7, “For God has not given us a spirit of fear, but of power and of love and of a sound mind.” Heard this verse related to the Trinity.
- Not to make light at all of what’s going on in our society – lots of chaos, lots of adjustments. Are we so distracted by what’s going on around us that we are missing Jesus right in front of us? Not physically, but always accessible.
- What power do we have that we aren’t using right now?
- When we know we are dearly loved, we step out in a new confidence.
- Wisdom comes from reading the words of Jesus. He gives us that sound mind. He doesn’t change. He doesn’t waver. He doesn’t speak out of both sides of his mouth.
