### **BACKGROUND OF PASSAGE**

- “Are these charges true?”
- Stephen summarized Old Testament and challenged the Sanhedrin.
- Israel had better be careful not to resist God’s workings as they had in the past.
- Stephen saw Jesus standing at the right hand of God.
- Saul agreed that Stephen should be stoned.
- Stephen prayed for his enemies.

### **FOR US TODAY**

- How far are we willing to go for our faith?
  - How would we react if we were told, “if you keep worshiping here, you will go to prison?”
  - How would we react if we were told, “if we catch you with a Bible, we will put you to death?”
- How important is our faith?
- We need to stay grounded right now.
