Sermon Notes:

INTRODUCTION

- Exodus starts with adventure.
- But then we hear about a lot of rules and regulations and laws...this is where it begins to get tough to keep reading.

BACKGROUND OF PASSAGE

- He has heard their cries of oppression.
- He sent Moses to Pharaoh.
- He orchestrated all sorts of plagues.
- He opened the hearts of the Egyptians.
- He went with them as a cloud by day and a pillar of fire by night.
- He fed them miraculously with manna.
- He cared for all their needs.
- And when Moses went up on the mountain to talk with God and leaves the people under Aaron's care...everything disintegrates.
- It isn't originally because they want to worship other gods. They did it because they got scared that they couldn't see God.
- Hebrew gets mixed up. It says in English that God "changed His mind" and decided not to harm the Israelites. But in fact, the word is "relent," which means to embark on another course of action.
- When Moses got back to the camp he smashed the Ten Commandments, symbolizing that the people had broken the covenant.
