Sermon Notes:

INTRODUCTION

- Picks up right where Exodus leaves off...in the tent of meeting
- Laws about cleanliness, sacrifices, worship, family life, sabbath, festivals

LEVITICUS

- Outline: offerings of the people, instructions for priests, institution of priests, judgment on two of Aarons sons, ritual cleanliness, Holiness code, sabbath and jubilee, covenant blessings and curses, vows and tithes
- Laws have to do with relationship
- Leviticus is part of the larger narrative

OFFERINGS THEN

- Specific ways of approaching God
- Have we tried to adapt so much to culture that we have lost the holiness?
- We don't want to get casual on the inside...

OFFERINGS NOW

- We offer ourselves to God – our bodies are a living sacrifice
- We talk about our spiritual lives a lot, but not about our physical lives
- How do we treat ourselves? As though the Holy Spirit dwells within us, as though we belong to ourselves and can do whatever we want, or as a living sacrifice?

AS WE JOURNEY THROUGH LENT

- Where have we gotten too casual in the ways we relate to God?
- What do we offer when we offer ourselves to God?

Whom do we need to forgive?
