Sermon Notes:

DAY OF ATONEMENT

- Yom Kippur = “yom” is day and “kippurim” is cleansing
- Most solemn holy day of all the Israelite feasts and festivals
- One goat sacrificed “because of the uncleanness and rebellion of the Israelites.” The other goat was used as a scapegoat.
- Yom Kippur is a legal holiday in the modern state of Israel.

CHRIST AS ATONEMENT

- Jesus came to make the “once for all” sacrifice so the need for cleansing ceremonies ceased.
- When His sacrifice was made, He declared, “It is finished” (John 19:30).
- Propitiation = act of appeasing the wrath of God.
- Expiation = act of atoning for sin and removing it from the sinner.
- The first goat paid for the sin – propitiation. The second goat removed the sins of the people – expiation.

WHAT DO WE DO INSTEAD?

- We do not have a specific day – we confess regularly.
- We do not need to remember every single sin we’ve ever committed, as we have the Holy Spirit living within us.

AS WE JOURNEY THROUGH LENT

- *Matthew 27:50-51, “Then Jesus cried again with a loud voice and breathed his last. At that moment the curtain of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom.”*
- This is the curtain from our passage – only Aaron was allowed back there and only once a year.
- Questions:
 1. When you think of repenting to God, what emotions accompany your thought? Fear? Condemnation? Relief? Joy?
 2. Why? What is your view of what God is like? Are you afraid of what He would say if He really knew your sin? Do you avoid Him because you feel condemned? Do you come to Him with joy because of His offer of forgiveness?

Where do we need to be awakened and revived?
