Sermon Notes:

WHY KEEP KOSHER?

- Definition: a food that is "right, proper, or fit to eat."
- Hygienic, moral lessons, national reasons, discipline
- Kosher in killing meat

HOW DO WE STAY UNDEFILED?

- Be careful with your thoughts – Proverbs 4:23, Be careful how you think; your life is shaped by your thoughts.
- Be careful what you see – Matthew 6:22, The eye is the lamp of the body. So, if your eye is healthy, your whole body will be full of light
- Be careful who you trust – Proverbs 3:5-6, Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths.
- Be careful what you hear – Mark 4:24, Then he added, "Pay close attention to what you hear. The closer you listen, the more understanding you will be given – and you will receive even more.
- Be careful with your words – Proverbs 18:21, Death and life are in the power of the tongue, and those who love it will eat its fruits.
- Be careful with your heart – Proverbs 4:23, Guard your heart above all else, for it determines the course of your life.
