Sermon Notes:

DAVID'S SIN

- To know what David did, we must go back a chapter:
- We see the escalation of temptation and sin...
- We often think we sin in secret

CONSEQUENCES OF DAVID'S SIN

- The Law does not demand death for theft, but kidnapping was a capital offense. Some commentators feel that David may have viewed the taking of a pet lamb as kidnapping a child (Ex. 21:16).
- Adultery/murder could = execution of even a king (Ex. 21:12; Lev. 20:10).
- David repented genuinely, presence of Nathan and in Psalm 51
- Though David could be restored to fellowship, the impact of his sin remained
- It could be an allusion to the death of four of David's sons:
 - Bathsheba's first son (2 Samuel 12:18)
 - Amnon (2 Samuel 13:28-9)
 - Absalom (2 Samuel 16:14-15)
 - Adonijah (1 Kings 2:25)
- Allusion to the four disasters marking the final days of David's reign:
 - Amnon's rape of Tamar and death at the hand of his brother Absalom
 - Absalom's rebellion and death by Joab
 - Sheba the Bishrite's rebellion and the plague following David's numbering of the people
 - The plot of Adonijah to take the throne
- The consequences of David's sins were passed down

CONSEQUENCES OF OUR SIN

- Some of it is the way we were raised
- In other cases, it's the way the enemy destroys us
- We begin to excuse our sin – habituation
- We need to look at our behavior through the lens of scripture
