Sermon Notes:

INTRODUCTION

- Harder passages to interpret: The man seemingly did what Saul asked him to and David had him killed for it.
- Lots of confusion about what it means not to touch the Lord's anointed.

SAUL'S HISTORY

- Saul was the first king of Israel
- Beginning of downfall...1 Samuel 13
- Lessons learned:
 - God desires our obedience.
 - Patience is often needed to fully follow God's Word.
 - There are negative consequences when we choose our own way instead of God's.
- Went downhill quickly from there

SAUL'S DEATH

- 1 Samuel 31:4b – *But his armor-bearer was unwilling; for he was terrified. So Saul took his own sword and fell upon it.*
- Very different story than we heard in our scripture for today
- Do not touch the Lord's anointed.

NOT TOUCHING THE LORD'S ANOINTED

- You can never hold a spiritual leader accountable – this is false.
- You can never criticize a spiritual leader – this is also false. But there is a Biblical and unbiblical way of doing this.
- Pray for those in authority.
- We can take the person to God. Always.
 - When it's a godly leader – protection, strength, perseverance, health, rest, restoration, courage, and to always follow God. Examples: Moses, Joshua, Deborah, Samuel.
 - When it is not a godly leader – pray for God to break in, for the person to hear the voice of the Holy Spirit, for conviction, for the truth to set that person free. Examples: Saul...who let jealousy of David overtake him and tried to kill David, who consulted a medium, who offered sacrifices to God when he had no right to.
