INTRODUCTION

- Didn't do it the way he was supposed to
- Suffered consequences
- Blessings were delayed

DIDN'T DO IT THE RIGHT WAY

- David gained control of Jerusalem
- Wanted to make it a religious center
- Cart hit a rough place in the road

SUFFERED CONSEQUENCES

- Not just the holiness of the ark but the fact that it was being transported improperly
- Looked good – new cart, people dancing and praising the Lord. But they had not treated the holy things of God with reverence.

BLESSINGS WERE DELAYED

- David was angry at God – for upholding His standards
- God clearly defined how things were to be done – they broke the rules
- David was afraid of God
- They got a second chance to get it right

FOR US TODAY

- We do not have the same kinds of rules they did
- But...how do we come into the presence of God?
- What is our attitude about coming to God?
