INTRODUCTION

- Trust is not something we do easily
- Today: Trust in God

BACKGROUND OF PASSAGE

- David says in vv 5-6, “*For God alone my soul waits in silence, for my hope is from him. He alone is my rock and my salvation, my fortress; I shall not be shaken.*”
- David waited on God
- David trusted in God
- David put his hope in God
- David refused to be shaken

FOR US TODAY

- Do we wait on God?
 - Pull ourselves up by our bootstraps – do things ourselves
 - Tempting to speed up to keep up – focus on God
 - Slide: God’s Voice vs. Satan’s Voice
- Do we trust in God?
 - To be confident or sure of
 - Do we put our trust in human things?
- Do we put our hope in God?
 - In secular terms, something that may or may not happen. In Christian terms, anticipation that something we truly believe will happen is coming.
 - Our hope is found in the Lord Jesus Christ
- Do we refuse to be shaken?
 - Yoked to God – cannot be shaken...immovable...security
 - Matthew 11:28-30 – *“Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light.”*
