- We jumped about 36 chapters from last week to this
- Overview of the book...Rev Don Shultz...

TODAY'S PASSAGE

- God is responding not just to Job's friends, but to Job as well
- It is okay to cry out to God. It is okay to pray for things to be different. But Job accused God of not knowing what He was doing.
- What was God's point in all this?

FOR US TODAY

- What can we learn from this?
- God does not cause evil to come on us
- When evil DOES come, we fight the enemy and temptation to blame God
- God didn't look like He knew what He was doing when it came to the cross

Some scriptures:

- *Proverbs 3:5 – Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and lean not on your own understanding*
- *Romans 15:13 – May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.*
