

SABBATH REST

There is no quick fix

- Acknowledge where we are – some feel fine, others may be struggling to put one foot in front of the other. Wherever you are, it is okay. (slide)
- Be gentler with ourselves – (slide) “Your Best...”
- Be gentler with each other – (slide) – what is our posture?
- Everyone – how to submit to God and let Him help us find that rhythm

What is this sabbath rest?

- Not one day, but continual resting in Jesus.
- Much like Matthew 11:28, “Come to me, all you who are weary and heavy-laden, and I will give you rest.”

Why is the sabbath rest important?

- Instead of relying on our blood, sweat, and tears, we allow God to work through us
- Philippians 4:13, “I can do all things through Christ who gives me strength.” We can do what *God wants us to do*.
- Counter-cultural – we are trained from a young age to pull ourselves up by our bootstraps” or “just get ‘er done.”

How do we enter this sabbath rest?

- Admit that life is not about us or others, but about what God wants
- Externals – what or who are we listening to that emphasizes doing everything on our own?
- Internals – what do we believe about achievement, success? What do we believe our purpose is?
- Practice being at rest throughout the day
